- 1. In addition, the monitoring activity will be done anytime within the calendar year and the monitoring tools to be used during the school visits are the Curriculum Implementation Division Program Monitoring Tool and the Management By Walking Around (MBWA) Tool which are attached in this memorandum. These monitoring tools are designed to assess the implementation of the EPP/TLE/TVL/SPTVE curriculum in schools. It aims to provide a structured framework for the monitor to gather data and evaluate the effectiveness of the curriculum delivery.

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- 5. Transportation and other incidental expenses during the conduct of the monitoring shall be charged against local funds subject to the existing accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
- 6. Everyone is highly encouraged to continually support and recognize the value of equality and diversity of all personnel while complying with the directives set forth by this office.
