Attached is the OUA Memorandum No. 00-0322-0020 dated March 2, 2022, entitled "Resumption of the Delivery of School-Based Health Services in Schools Participating in the Pilot Implementation of Limited Face-to-Face Classes".

Consistent with the DepEd-DOH Joint Memorandum Circular 2021-01 titled "Operational Guidelines on the Implementation of Limited Face-to-Face Learning Modality" (Item Nos. 7.4.5. and 7.4.6.), the Office of the Undersecretary for Administration, through the Bureau of Learner Support Services – School Health Division (BLSS-SHD), directs all schools that are implementing face-to-face classes to resume the delivery of school-based health services to learners.

These includes:

- 1. Health assessment:
- 2. Nutritional assessment (height and weight taking);
- 3. Vision screening;
- 4. Deworming;
- 5. Immunization; and
- 6. Other medical, dental and nursing services.

Health services shall preferably be delivered to the learners as they attend the face-to-face-to-face classes in schools.

Schools may also request learners, who are in the home-based learning modality, to report to the school solely for the purpose of availing these services.

Schools are also asked to resume the recording and reporting of learner's data generated through forms being filled up for Basic Education Information System (BEIS) or for the School Dental Health Care Program (SDHCP).

Schools that have not joined the pilot implementation of limited face-to-face classes shall continue with the community-based delivery of health services. This is covered in OUA Memorandum No. 00-1020-0198 titled Advisory on the Implementation of the Medical-Nursing Services and the Adolescent Reproductive Health Program for SY 2020-2021.

Officials in these schools are encouraged to allow the use of their premises for the Community-Based Immunization, especially if DepEd learners are among the beneficiaries. Good day in the name of Public Service!

This has reference to the request letter you sent dated 21 February 2022, requesting for the approval for the conduct of SCHOOL DENTAL HEALTH CARE PROGRAM (SDHCP) FLOURIDE VARNISH APPLICATION TO ALL KINDER TO GRADE 1 LEARNERS from February to June 2022 to ALL SCHOOLS of KAPALONG, DAVAO DEL NORTE, the Incident Management Team (IMT) decided to ALLOW the said activity.

On the other hand, these are the following remarks and precautionary health measures to be strictly observed at all times during the conduct of the said activity, to wit:

- a. Fully vaccinated personnel and participants are ALLOWED to participate in the said activity;
- b. The LGU highly encourages the schools to have the students get vaccinated before Dental Examination for the health care workers utmost safety. If unvaccinated, it shall be of the Dep-Ed and/or Dentist's assessment and discretion to proceed for the mentioned activity.
- Proper wearing of facemask and maintaining physical social distancing at all times outside and inside the said activity;
- Individual bringing of alcohol, sanitizer is highly encouraged;
- e. Availability of alcohol/sanitizers/QR Code/Scanner is required in conspicuous places;
- Making sure that all individuals who enter the area are not included in COVID-19 close contacts;
- Individuals with symptoms like fever, cough and colds are prohibited during the conduct;
- h. Uploading of photos to social media shall be at utmost care;
- Log booking of attendees with address and contact number is required for contract tracing purposes; and
- Monitoring Team shall conduct inspection without any notices.

Any violation of the protocols is the liability of the addressee and subject for legal proceedings based on executive orders and municipal ordinances. As preventive measures in combating COVID-19, LGU Kapalong is implementing *Municipal Ordinance No. 1159* wherein, penalties shall be imposed to individuals not wearing facemask and does not observe social distancing.

We are hoping for your cooperation in fighting this pandemic through following the abovementioned protocols and encouraging everyone to be vaccinated. Thank you and God bless.
